

However, on 22 May 1991 the *Prints and Graphics of Zimbabwe* newspaper published a cartoon depicting a white man, a black man and a woman, all dressed in traditional Zulu attire, standing in a field. The man on the left is holding a rifle, the man in the middle is holding a bow and arrow, and the woman on the right is holding a spear. The caption reads: 'The three main ethnic groups in Zimbabwe: the white, the black and the Zulu.' This cartoon was a clear reference to the fact that the Zulu are the largest ethnic group in Zimbabwe, and that the white and black populations are the two main ethnic groups in the country.
