- 3. The animals described above originate from:
 - a) An O.I.E. recognized Foot and Mouth Disease -free zone in Namibia and the farm is not under veterinary restriction for diseases to which the species are susceptible.
 - b) Premises at least 80 kilometers removed from any place where Foot and Mouth Disease and Rift Valley Fever have occurred within the preceding 6 months.
 - c) Namibia and the country is historically free from East Coast Fever, Vesicular Stomatitis, Scrapie and Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy.
 - d) Herds which are healthy and have no history of reported or diagnosed cases of the following diseases Johnes disease, rabies, brucellosis tuberculosis,

enzootic bovine leucosis and clinically free from leptospirosis, vibriosis and trichmoniasis.

INSTRUCTIONS IN RESPECT OF CATTLE IMPORTED INTO ZIMBABWE FROM REPUBLIC OF NAMIBIA

INSTRUCTIONS:

- A. All cattle will be detained at the designated Quarantine Yards at the importers expense, and subjected to the tuberculin test and any other tests that may be considered necessary by the Director of Veterinary Services.
- B. Normally cattle will be detained for approximately four days while being tested for tuberculosis. If however, any cattle have been subjected to the tuberculin test within thirty days if importation, they will be detailed until a period of thirty days from that test has elapsed. They will then be given the routine import tuberculin test.
- C. While en route to the railhead and while intransit the cattle must not contact any other cattle unless the cattle are also traveling to the designated Veterinary Ouarantine Station
- D. The cattle may not be off-loaded while traveling through another country and during that period no fodder or bedding may be taken on board.
- E. Due care and attention will be exercised by the Government Veterinary Officials dealing with the animals at the port of entry but no responsibility for loss or damage which might occur during off-loading, loading or detention will be accepted.
- F. Any animals which, in the opinion of the Director of Veterinary Services, is likely to transmit an infectious or contagious disease may be returned to the Namibia subject to the consent of the Director of Veterinary Services, Namibia, or destroyed without compensation.

N.B. In the event of the Health Certificate becoming detached from the consignment note, the animals will be held in quarantine at the owner's expense, pending the arrival of the duplicate Health Certificate by post.
