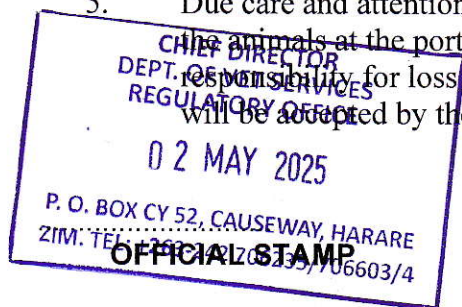

2. The animals must not come into contact with any other animals whilst en route to their destination.
3. Animals traveling by motor or rail transport may neither be off loaded nor may bedding or fodder taken on board while en route

4. The Provincial Veterinary Officer at..... must be advised timeously of the date of arrival of the sheep /goats, which will be inspected by him and identification checked. The sheep/ goats will remain on these premises in quarantine for a period of...**30**.....days. During this time veterinary officials may come from time to time to inspect these animals.

5. Due care and attention will be exercised by Government officials dealing with the animals at the port of entry or at the quarantine premises, but no responsibility for loss or injury which might occur during testing or detention will be accepted by the Department of Veterinary Services

having examined these animals individually, do hereby certify that the sheep, goats:

1. Are healthy, fit to travel and are free from clinical evidence, of infectious or contagious disease including Scab
2. Originate from an area free from quarantine restrictions for disease of sheep and goats including foot and mouth disease
3. Come from a farm on which there has been no case of Johne's disease during the preceding 5 years and the farm is free from louping ill no history of Chlamydial infection, Maedi-Visna and Pulmonary adenomatosis.
4. South Africa has been free from Scrapie for the past 5 years
5. Have tested negative for Infectious Epididymitis (*Brucella ovis*) by SAT/RBT or Compliment Fixation Test and are clinically free from the disease (**laboratory results to be e-mailed to Director Veterinary Services before shipment.**)
6. Originate from a farm certified free of *Brucella mellitensis* or the animals were isolated for 30 days prior to shipment and all animals in isolation tested negative for *Brucella mellitensis* by SAT/RBT or Compliment Fixation Test and are clinically free from the disease . In the case of post-parturient females, the test was carried out at least 30 days after giving birth. (**laboratory results to be e-mailed to Director Veterinary Services before shipment.**)
7. The semen of rams has been examined microscopically and found to be free from *Br. Ovis* infection
8. Have never crossed, on hoof, any area under disease control restrictions within 60 days prior to departure

NOTE:

- (a) All bedding and fodder accompanying the animals must be obtained from an area free of foot and mouth disease control restrictions for the past 6 months
- (b) The health certificates should be completed by a Government Veterinary Officer 14 days before exportation of the animals.
- (c) Sheep and goats have to be quarantined under State Veterinarian's Supervision for a period of not less than 14 days prior to departure.
- (d) Sheep and goats have to be conveyed by mechanical transport from the Quarantine Station to the port of embarkation without coming into contact with any other animals before loading for export.
